A new year means fresh beginnings and I would like to remind everyone of the importance of regular attendance. So far we have made a good start with few absences, so I'm hoping this trend continues. Thank you to those who respond to the sms messages sent when a child has been marked absent as it assists us in knowing where your child is.

Every public school in Western Australia will be reviewed under this new process, every three years. All aspects of the school will be recognised, with areas of improvement identified to further growth into the future. The review will also give assurance to the Minister, Director General and our community about the performance of our school, to ensure we are operating effectively, and delivering high quality education to the students.

FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Welcome to the 2019 school year! Our students have settled back into their classes and are working hard to ensure a successful academic year. We have started the year well by invigorating lots of new and existing school initiatives.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP TEAMS

Our student leaders have been selected and announced for 2019. Our student council and sport captains are very eager to get involved and have been an active student voice so far. This year, we plan to increase the accountability of our student leaders with a more formalised approach to give them a greater opportunity to impact our school community.

In three very short weeks, our leaders have made contact with the shire to organise a meet and greet, have conducted their first assembly and coordinated the opening of the Library during lunch time on Tuesdays and Thursdays. In addition to this, they are in the midst of planning a new 'Book Club' initiative and are putting forth many suggestions for fundraising opportunities and school events.

As a component of the leadership program, the student leadership team, along with myself, will attend Camp Kulin for two days during week four to develop and hone their leadership skills with other students from Eastern Wheatbelt schools.

YSSSA SWIMMING CARNIVAL

On Friday the 1st March 2019, students from Pre Primary to Year 6 will be participating in the annual YSSSA swimming carnival. Miss Robbins has been working hard to prepare for the carnival to ensure a successful day for all Southern Cross DHS, Moorine Rock Primary School and St Joseph's Primary School students.

As our focus continues to be on participation, students will participate in team events with students from a combination of other school teams. This will ensure the maximum number of children have the opportunity to engage in the activities on the day. Students will receive the respective place ribbon of the team they compete in for an event, however, no team points will be given. Please remind your child/children to try their best regardless of what team they are in for an event.

There will continue to be individual champions awarded for each year group, however, please note that for events in which there are more than 5 people eligible, the timing of each competitor will determine places from the heats. In this instance, no finals will take place and placings will be based on times.

Please be reminded that, regardless of age, any student who has not passed or achieved swimming stage 2 will not be able to be in the 'big pool'. For this reason, it is important that our swimming records for your child are current so that they can be correctly placed in the marshalled events. If your child completed Vac Swim over the summer holidays and you are yet to provide a copy of the updated certificate, please ensure this is done as soon as possible. In addition, all permission forms were due for submission on Monday 18th February so if you are yet to bring in a signed permission note please do so as soon as possible.

We encourage parents to come and watch during the day, and I'm sure your child would love for you to be there if you can make it. Unfortunately, I will miss the carnival due to attending an awards ceremony in Perth, but I wish all our P-6 students an enjoyable day.

CLASSROOM VISITS

Being new to the school, I have been making every effort to get into the classrooms this week to get to know the students, assist them with their class work and to appreciate the wonderful things that are happening at Southern Cross District High School on a daily basis.

I have joined the Kindy to Year 1 class during their morning song and helped them try and find the 'Green Sheep' in their Talk 4 Writing daily task. We also spent some time at recess skipping and 'cooking' in the sand pit where I observed some lovely manners as well as many friendships developing and firming.

When visiting the Year 2-4 class, I witnessed a polished Talk 4 Writing performance that included some very high level expressions for words and sentences. I was also able to help them with their morning writing tasks where students were creatively using scenic pictures to practice their adjectives to describe the images. When completing their stories, it was great to see them use these describing words to strengthen their plot. During this class, I also observed some excellent individualised teaching for a few students who were participating in a personalised literacy program with the support of an Education Assistant. The positive impact of this was obvious in strengthening their pronunciation and recognition of words.

In the Year 9 Home Economics class, I participated in a 'Master Chef' blind food tasting activity. Students competed in groups of 3 to sample a range of healthy foods whilst blindfolded. The challenge was to use their taste, touch and smell senses to determine the food type. It was great to see the competiveness of the children emerge as points were awarded for correct guesses and spelling. The facial expressions of many students were priceless and they appeared to be having a great introductory lesson to the subject!

I am already looking forward to visiting the Year 5/6 class as well as more secondary classes in the coming weeks.
