As a connected community, your local school is a reflection of what is best in all of us. The STRIVE motto is about achieving our personal best. I have been impressed by the school community in setting these high standards as they support all of us in navigating the challenges that both students and the wider community experience from time to time.

Safety; Take responsibility; Achieve; Respect; and Support are lifelong values that all staff at Southern Cross DHS model and the support of parents is very much appreciated.

GOOD STANDING - ATTENDANCE

Regular school attendance is an expectation of all students and is critical in order to maximise their academic, social and emotional development.

If a student is absent, an acceptable reason for their nonattendance must be provided. If an acceptable reason cannot be supplied or verified, this may impact your child's ability to participate in the reward blocks that are aligned with 'Good Standing'.

Good Standing acknowledgements will take place at the end of <u>each term</u>. Only students with 'Good Standing' and an <u>attendance percentage above 90%</u> for the term, will be eligible and acknowledged.

- Any student who has <u>between 80-90% attendance</u> must supply evidence for absent days, such as medical certificate or documentation, in order to be eligible.
- Any student who has <u>below 80% attendance</u> will automatically be ineligible, unless there are extenuating circumstances.

Parents will be notified by an attendance letter if your child is at risk of not being eligible.





ON-ENTRY, OLNA & NAPLAN ASSESSMENT

As mandated by the Department of Education, there are many assessments that your child is required to participate in during their time at school.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish the students every success as they prepare for the upcoming testing periods outlined below.



Do not forget to 'Strive' to achieve YOUR personal best!

As present, the Pre-Primary, Year 1 and Year 2 students are in the middle of their On-Entry Assessment (OEA) with their classroom teachers. This information will be invaluable and will greatly assist their teachers in their planning and the monitoring of your child's progress.

During week 5, the OLNA assessment for Year 10 students commenced. Only a selection of our students are required to participate in this assessment, all identified students, and their caregivers have been notified of this.

To assist them, students have already commenced an OLNA support program where they receive instructional support and access to the SCSA (School Curriculum & Standards Authority) online practice tests.

Our Education Assistant, Leanne Childs, has also been working closely with the OLNA students over the past few weeks. Thank you to Leanne for sharing her expertise.

Next term, our Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will participate in the annual NAPLAN assessment. More details will be provided later in the term, and students will have the opportunity to participate in practice sessions, as we get closer to the testing window.

SWIMMING CARNIVAL (Yr. 7 – 10)

The Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 secondary cohorts will be given the opportunity to participate in an interschool swimming carnival that will be hosted by the South Central District High School Sports Association. The carnival will be held at Narembeen and involves the following District High Schools: Bruce Rock; Corrigin; Kulin; Narembeen; and Southern Cross.

The carnival will take place on Friday, March 19, 2021.

Miss. Jones will be the teacher in charge, therefore, all documentation inclusive of notes to parents will be sent out this week.

I would request that parents encourage their son/daughter to participate as it provides them not only the opportunity to participate, but also to connect to their peers in our Region.

FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

SCHOOL OF Isolated= AND DISTANCE EDUCATION (SIDE)

This year, our Year 7-10 and Year 2/3 students have been engaging with SIDE for some of their lessons. This has been a new initiative for the school and one that is proving to be very positive.

Our Year 2/3 students have been completing their Indonesian lessons by SIDE. These lessons have been delivered by WEBEX on the interactive white-board screen and students have been working with Mr Keating to complete the assigned activities.

The Year 7-10 students have been completing their English work by SIDE. It took a couple of lessons for the students to adjust to the new learning style, but since then it has been fantastic. Between the 22 students in the secondary area, there are 9 SIDE teachers who are working closely with our students. This means that there is a very individualised approach to their English classes and each student is therefore working at the appropriate levels. Each week, the students have one online class with their respective teacher where they learn knew content and have the opportunity to discuss the schedule for the week. For the remainder of each week, I have been working diligently with the students to complete their weekly tasks and helping them through the activities.

This new and innovative way of learning has encouraged the students to be more organised and independent when completing their work. Students have already had the opportunity to further develop their computer expertise as well as their general communication skills. It has been great to see the students actively engaging and showing initiative to collaborate with their teachers by email and the Moodle platform.

In week 9 of this term, the Year 7-10 students will be travelling to the SIDE campus in Leederville to meet their teachers and to participate in an intensive face-to-face learning block. They will spend a couple of nights at SIDE and will also have to opportunity to visit the new Western Australian Museum.

NUTURING THE FUTURE PROGRAM

This term, the Year 7-10 students are focussing on two projects: Sustainability and Pool Safety.

During their class on Monday's, the secondary students have been divided into three sustainability groups. Over the course of the term, they will have the opportunity to rotate through each group to facilitate several sustainability projects outlined below:

- <u>Project 1: Worm farm and paper recycling</u> the students will manage the worm farm and collect the scraps from the primary classes to then feed and maintain the worms. They are also in charge of recycling paper in each of the classrooms.
- <u>Project 2: High School garden</u> students have been working with our lovely gardener, Rob Southall, to get the high school garden up-to-scratch. So far, this has involved weeding the area and preparing the soil. The students have also selected some produce they wish to grow and have completed a visual diagrammatic plan of the garden. Once the soil preparation is finalised, they will be able to begin planting their vegetables.
- <u>Project 3: Plastic bottle caps and ring pulls</u> students are encouraging each class to collect plastic bottle caps and ring pulls. These will be collated and donated to the appropriate organisations to be used to benefit our broader society.

On Friday's they have been completing a 'Pool Safety' unit with Sandy Ciabarri. In the initial session, they were taught 3 types of rescues including throw, reach and wade. They also practiced some water entries. Last week, the students practiced a survival swim and rescues wearing full length clothing.




We would like to thank Sandy for volunteering her time with the students and we are looking forward to what's in store for the rest of the sessions this term!
