FROM THE PRINCIPAL

TEDDY BEAR HOSPITAL SESSION

Curtin and Notre Dame University students participated in a medical student immersion program.

Southern Cross DHS was very pleased to host the program with the medical students interacting with the Kindergarten to Year 3 cohorts and later in the morning the Year 7 - 10 students.

The university students gained an understanding of a rural patient's life and healthcare experience. During their placement, the students visited local schools, health services such as the local general practice and hospital, and attended a farm safety demonstration.

NAPLAN - PRACTICE TEST

The Naplan Practice Test was conducted this week. The aim of the test was to refresh students in how the online Naplan Testing process is conducted.

Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 did a practice test in writing whilst the Year 3 students attempted an omnibus test which covered reading, numeracy and conventions of language.

The practice test is also tested our local connectivity so as to identify any weaknesses in our system.

It was a fantastic opportunity to make the most of the new swimming pool and what an amazing facility it is! It was also a great way to 'beat the heat' so the students could remain active on those scorching summer days.



Whilst the younger students mostly focussed on water familiarisation activities, the older students participated in a range of water-based sports throughout the 6-week block of swimming. From all accounts, it was very successful and the students really enjoyed it. It was particularly useful in preparing for the YSSSA and Secondary swimming carnivals and hope to make it an annual occurrence going forward.

Miss Jones has provided the following additional commentary... This Term in PE the K-10 students have been at the pool. The students have focused on a range of things including stroke technique, how to save yourself and others in a rescue and even some water sports like modified water polo and water volleyball. It has been great to use the town facilities.

We would like to thank the Shire for allowing us to use the pool over the 7-week period, the students thoroughly enjoyed swimming and cooling down on those hot days!

We also purchased a brand new netball post, which has been a hit at recess and lunch times. This will allow our students to practice on a standardised size hoop, which will hopefully impact our results at country week for the netball girls!
