OLNA & PROGRESSIVE ACHIEVEMENT TESTING (PAT) ASSESSMENTS

In week 7 and 8, selected Year 10 students will participate in the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA). Students who have not already achieved a band 8 in previous NAPLAN assessments, will have the opportunity to sit a Writing, Reading and/or Numeracy assessment to demonstrate their proficiency in these areas. This assessment will help students achieve their WACE in Years 11 and 12 by demonstrating a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy.

In weeks 9 and 10, students in Years 1-10 will participate in the Progressive Achievement Test by sitting online assessments in the following areas:

- Vocabulary
- Comprehension
- Grammar
- Maths
- Science
- Social Emotional Well-being



These assessments are part of our whole-school assessment schedule and are designed to track academic progress from year-to-year, which helps to inform our teachers in regards their short-term and long-term programming and planning.

NSOS SURVEY

The National School Opinion Survey (NSOS) is now live. There are 3 different surveys that are mandated by the Department, including one for staff, students and parents/community members. This is an important process for us so that we can gain some valuable insights and feedback about specific areas of our



school. We strongly encourage everyone to participate and have their say. It is also worth noting that all survey responses are anonymous.





Therefore, Friday lunch orders will continue as normal.




