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FROM THE PRINCIPAL


HAPPY HOLIDAYS

ATTENDANCE

It is so pleasing to see the improvements in regular attendance this semester and our thanks go to our staff, parents and students in working together to achieve these results. I have attached below the graph of our attendance data to date and the graph for Semester 1 last year, which clearly shows our positive start this term.

Our next area to target is the number of students (20.8%) we still have in the indicated risk category. This bracket means children are missing 1 day a week, which might not seem like a big deal, but when you realise that equates to 2 months of the year missed, it really does have an impact on their academic achievement.

DRUG EDUCATION

Week 1: Introduction to Caffeine and energy drinks

Caffeine is a stimulant drug that comes from a range of plants such as tea, coffee, cacao pod (used to make cocoa and chocolate) and guarana (used in energy bars and energy drinks).

Is there a safe limit for caffeine?

There is currently no recognised health-based guidance value, such as an Acceptable Daily Intake, for caffeine. However, a FSANZ Expert Working Group analysed the available literature in 2000 and concluded that there was evidence of increased anxiety levels in children at doses of about 3 mg of caffeine per kilogram of bodyweight per day. The anxiety level for children aged 5-12 equates to a caffeine dose of 95 mg per day (approximately two cans of cola) and about 210 mg per day (approximately three cups of instant coffee) for adults.


